

Well, what a great effort and performance from our athletes at the recent Oceania Shooting Federation Continental Championships in Sydney! We have won all five quote places available for pistol to compete in the 2016 Olympic Games in Rio.

The charge to win quote places started with Elena Galiabovitch (VIC) in 25m Pistol Women, followed by Christopher Summerell (NSW) in 10 Air Pistol Men. Lalita Yauhleuskaya (VIC) came next in 10m Air Pistol Women, followed by Daniel Repacholi (NSW) in 50m Pistol Men and David Chapman (SA) in 25m Rapid Fire Pistol Men. A great result for Australia! Congratulations to all.

As to who fills the quota places, we will make the final decision after the two selection competitions in 2016.

The Action Pistol Team has just been announced. Team members are Craig Ginger (NSW), Brett Foster (QLD), Andrew Penney (QLD) and Zeljko Cvetnic (VIC). The team, along with the new team manager Geoff Horton (VIC), will head off to the US in May to compete in the 2016 Bianchi Cup.

Also just announced is the Metallic Silhouette Team, travelling to South Africa in July for the IMSSU World Championships. Members are Kim Emery (NSW), Matt Seears (NSW), Scott Dawson (QLD) and Mick Arden (VIC), with team manager Judy Harding (QLD).

I take this opportunity to thank all the Associations and Clubs that hosted National Championships on behalf of Pistol Australia throughout the year. I also thank the numerous club members and volunteers who assisted with the running of these competitions.

The first being the 100m Small Bore and Field Pistol Metallic Silhouette National Championship held from 6 – 8th March by the Toogoolawah Pistol Club. This was closely followed by the 2015 ISSF/PA National Championships hosted by the South Australian Revolver and Pistol Association, conducted by the Adelaide Pistol and Shooting Club over the Easter period.

Next came the 200m Big Bore Metallic Silhouette National Championships held from 18 – 20th September, hosted by the Sporting Shooters (ACT) Pistol Club.

Last, but not least, was the final Nationals for the year – the Action Pistol National Championships. This was also hosted by the South Australian Rifle and Pistol Association at the Adelaide Pistol and Shooting Club. To all who assisted, thank you!

I would also like to use the bulletin to thank all our volunteers who devote a great deal of time, energy and money in helping run the events that Shooting Australia conducts over the year, mainly at the Sydney International Shooting Centre. Regardless of whether it is an Aus Cup, Grand Prix or the Oceania Championships, it's always the same crew that turns up to run the competitions. THANK YOU ALL! IT would be great to see some new and younger faces.

I hope you all have a great Christmas and I will see you on a range somewhere in 2016.

First of all, don't forget the annual junior camp which will be held in Canberra from the $2^{nd} - 9^{th}$ July 2016!

The camp is held during the school holidays for most states. Next year, there will be a change in accommodation from previous years. With the support of Shooting Australia, we have managed to acquire the facilities at the Australian Institute of Sport (AIS). We will be accommodated at the hall of excellence, a new section and part of the cafeteria block. The athletes will also be able to use other facilities at the AIS when they have finished their training. AIS also will supply a 12 seater bus as part of the accommodation costs.

If you are not one of the juniors who are invited back from the 2015 camp and you would like to attend, please contact your State/Territory coaching director and tell them that you are interested in attending. It's a great weekend of training, as well as a bit of fun!

Recently, the NCC and Management approved a new coaching course for our members who are interested in coaching Service Pistol and WA1500 matches. It is a generic, basic course covering the main principles in those matches. It is very similar to the PA Club Instructors course and is only approved and recognised by Pistol Australia. Those who sit and pass will receive an accreditation card from PA.

While on basic coaching, it would appear that many clubs are not giving their newer (and older, for that matter) members enough coaching in our matches. They are left to continually battle to improve their standard of scores. This leaves them frustrated to the stage that many let their membership lapse. To assist these members, clubs should contact their State Coaching Directors and, at the minimum, request they

conduct the Club Instructors Course for your members. This will at least give them the principles of pistol shooting.

Over the weekend of 17th 0 18th October, the NCC ran a coaching seminar at the AIS in Canberra. Accommodation was also at the Institute. There were 58 coaches in attendance from all States and Territories. The feedback from them on the questionnaire was encouraging, with most wanting to know when the next would be held. For those interested, it will not be for at least three years. I must acknowledge Cath Fetter, ACT Coaching Director, who was solely responsible for all the work involved in arranging the presenters and attendees at the seminar. See article in the February issue of the Bulletin.

With the support of Shooting Australia, Vladimir Galiabovich, High Performance Pistol Coach, has arranged a 14 day coaching camp with the Korean Shooting Federation in Korea. This will be held from the 8th – 23rd December 2016. There are eight athletes attending: Emily Esposito, Christopher Summerell, Jason Faulkner, Sascha Kroopin (NSW), Thomas Ashmore (ACT), Bailey Groves (TAS), Kristy Gillman and Brenton Barling (VIC). Along with our athletes will be Peter Heuke, Alex Kupke (NDS Coaches) and Vladimir. Both Sascha and Brenton are self funded, while the others are funded by Shooting Australia (SA) and Pistol Australia (PA), as the athletes are either members of the SA HP Squad or the PA National Development Squad.

May I wish you all a merry Christmas and plenty of 10's and good shooting in 2016.

What is the NRC Up To?

One thing I have very quickly discovered is that there are some things that seem to forever be "an issue".

Some are legitimate. Others, not quite so much! So, in this bulletin, I am hoping to address some of the things the NRC has been working on recently.

These protocols are avales on the PA website procedures.

First – and probably foremost in many minds – chronographing of loads.

Testing ammunition with a chronograph has been around Pistol Australia since the inception of the Service Match rules and the uptake of the Action Match discipline. In recent times, it has been extended to include ISSF Rapid Fire. So, what are the issues?

It is rare to hear of problems within Action Match – the procedures are documented in the NRA rule and, in the majority of cases, the shooters load their ammunition with sufficient margin to ensure they will pass. A common gun is used – with provision to use the competitor's own gun, if necessary – and the competitor rarely even knows where the chronograph is set up!

The procedures developed over the years for the Service matches are somewhat different. This is probably due, in part, to the many different guns that can be used. Also because the rules were written in Australia for Australians – we can be a picky bunch at times!

The ISSF Rapid Fire procedure is different again — power factor is not used. Instead, there is a minimum projectile weight and a minimum velocity requirement. Nor are we required to test the ammunition of all the competitors. Instead, it is a random draw, as is the case for all ISSF post competition checks.

Most of the angst arises from concerns about inconsistent testing practices, as well as the accuracy (or otherwise) of the chronograph. It is simply not possible to provide a calibrated chronograph. There is no testing agency in the world that would certify such a calibration outside of laboratory conditions. As we expect to use our chronograph in all sorts of weather and light conditions, laboratory calibration would lead to far more inconsistencies! In an attempt to address these concerns, the NRC has developed a procedure for testing the chronograph as well as a protocol for testing ammunition. The procedures will be adopted at the 2016 PA/ISSF National Championships in Perth and are recommended for use at other sanctioned competitions. A review will be conducted after Easter 2016 – any feedback at that time will be welcome!

Next is the issue of holster accreditation.

Some of the safety concerns have been addressed by the updated regulations published earlier in the year. These regulations are fully enforceable from 1st January 2016. There is a new holster accreditation course which has been delivered by some of our examiners already. I am grateful for the feedback received from these examiners and many of their recommendations have already been taken up. I am confident that we now have a workable course that should meet all our requirements.

Still on holster cards! The procedures are:

Holster Safety Accreditation cards (new and renewals) are issued by the state association — either by the administration or by the referee council (each state is different). New cards are issued once the candidate has successfully passed the course and the examiner is happy to sign off. Renewal processes vary from state to state.

Holster Examiner Accreditation cards (new and renewals) are issues by the NRC Director.
Candidates must complete an application form – either for a new card or for a renewal – and submit it to the State Referee Council Director for approval.

Holster Assessor Accreditation cards are also issued by the NRC Director on the request of the State Referee Council. In the case if a new application, these cards will be subject to the candidate having some experience and qualification in training and assessment. In principle, there will only be one or two assessors in each region.

And one for the ISSF shooters - variations to the published ISSF rules!

The ISSF rule book is written with the top shooters and top shooting competitions in mind. This includes the use of electronic targets, expectation of a media presence, etc. While the rules do (at this stage) still recognise that many ranges require the use of paper targets, there is an expectation that major competitions will be held on electronic targets. Clearly, this is a problem for us (and other nations, might I add).

Because of the above, Pistol Australia assess all changes made by the ISSF and, on the recommendation of the NRC, either adopts, varies or ignores the changes. To give you an example: unless requested, we do not test the blinders being worn as that rule is purely so that the TV crews and photographers can get face shots!

I often hear comments about the "voluntary" equipment control – this has not been adopted by Pistol Australia! Why not? Because we decided we are not in the business of trapping shooters with random tests. Seasoned competitors understand the importance of ensuring their equipment complies – newer competitors could easily be caught out.

Any variations or omissions approved by Pistol Australia do NOT carry over to competitions run by Shooting Australia.

Not to be left out – out officials (judges and range officers of all disciplines):

We are currently in the process of updating and renewing all Officials accreditations. Most of the Judges A and many of the Judges B licenses have been renewed and the state directors are busy getting the ISSF range officers up to speed.



Next cab off the rank will be a full review of the Service and Black Powder rules – no major changes anticipated, just a tidy up of some areas. If you have anything you want considered (or even omitted), than please let me know. This won't be a quick process, nor will it be a one person job. But, once it is done and submitted for approval, it will be too late to make further changes!

The Pistol Australia office will close on **Friday**, **18 December 2015** until **Monday**, **4 January 2016**. Location

Accommodation on site

Unfortunately, during the fire season, camping is not permitted anywhere within Whiteman Park.

Catering on the Range

Breakfasts, light meals and snacks will be available all day in the club house.

Temporary Firearms Permits (required for ALL interstate competitors)

Commence the application process through the WA Police website.

Click here to download "Temporary Permits Form 6"

Individual permits - fee \$58, available for a period of 90 days.

Applications should be made at least 2 months in advance of required date.

Group application - no fee, available for period of 90 days.

Group applications should be signed by the Team Manager or Team Captain and should be made at least 2 months in advance of required date.

All other conditions are listed on the application form - "Temporary Permits Form 6"

Conditions of Entry

- All resident Australian competitors must be a current financial member of Pistol Australia.
- Smoking is prohibited on or near any range, within any permanent or temporary building or licensed area or within 5 meters of any open doorway or window.
- All persons must wear enclosed footwear on the ranges.
- Competitors may not wear tank tops or upper garments with loose fitting necks.
- Mobile phones and pagers must be turned to Off or to Vibrate Only, BEFORE entering ranges.
- All persons attending the Clubs facilities must sign the Attendance Book.
- Children under 12 years of age must be supervised at all times.
- Firearms and/or gun boxes must not be left unattended anywhere on the range or in unlocked motor vehicles. The Club has a number of lockers on each range for use on a first in basis. These lockers are DAY USE ONLY, no overnight use. Please provide your own padlock for the locker.
- WA Police provided Temporary Firearms Permits and/or Licences and Holster Proficiency cards must be submitted for checking at Equipment Control.
- Phone entries will not be accepted.
- Entries without full payment will not be accepted.
- Late entries may be accepted at the discretion of the Organising Committee.
- The Whiteman Park International Pistol Club holds a Restricted Liquor License, therefore:
 - o The Liquor Licensing Act WA prevents opening of the Bar or service of alcohol on Good Friday;
 - BYO alcohol is not permitted anywhere on the Whiteman Park International Pistol Club facilities at any time (this is a Liquor Licensing Act provision).

This is the major event in the four year Olympic cycle. The event where Pistol Australia athletes can win quota places for Australia to compete in the 2016 Rio Olympic Games.

Quota places can also be won at other ISSF Championships in the period between August 2014 and March 2016, leading up to the Olympic Games. In the qualification match, athletes must shoot the Minimum Qualifying Score (MQS) or better in the final to be eligible for a quota place. The MSQ scores are: 540 for 50m Pistol; 560 for 25m Rapid Fire Pistol; 563 for 10m Air Pistol Men; 555 for 25m Air Pistol Women; and 365 for 10m Air Pistol Women. The three members of the "A" Team are the only athletes who can go through to the final and win the quota place.

Day Three: The first match contested was 25m Pistol Women. Elena Galiabovitch (AUS) won the Gold Medal, as well as the first quota place for Australia (in pistol). Silver went to Linda Ryan (AUS), with bronze going to Lalita Yauhleuskaya (AUS). Elena was the front runner all the way in the semi-final stage of the finals. Lalita shot off with Jocyln Lees (NZL) in the Bronze Medal match, with a comfortable win of 8pts to 2pts. Elena followed suit in the semi-final, leaving no doubt about her Gold Medal match win of 7pts to 3pts. In the teams event, Australia "A" (Elena Galiabovitch, Linda Ryan and Lalita Yauhleuskaya) took first place, with Australia "B" (Kristy Gillman, Hayley Chapman and Una Rossetto) coming second and New Zealand third.

Day Four: There are also two non-Olympic events in the championships. The first competition was the 25m Centre Fire Pistol Men, which saw Gary Mullins (AUS) winning the Gold. Jason Wakeling (NZL) took the Silver and Peter Fitzpatrick (AUS) the Bronze. The Australian "A" Team of Gary Mullins, Kerry Bell and Mike Gustiniano won the team's event from New Zealand, followed by New Caledonia.

Day Five: Four competitions were shot. The first was the 10m Air Pistol Men, in which Christopher Summerell was the only Australian to achieve an MSQ from the "A" Team. Two athletes from New Zealand qualified, so the final was certainly going to be all important for Australia to win the quota place. As the final progressed, it became evident that the two New Zealand athletes were going to be eliminated early. When it was down to only the three Australians left in the final, it didn't matter what position Christopher finished in. He was going to win the quota place for Australia. Blake Blackburn ended up winning the Gold, with Daniel Repacholi winning Silver and Christopher Summerell winning the Bronze.

In the team event, Australia "A" (Daniel Repacholi, Blake Blackburn and Christopher Summerell) took the Gold, New Zealand the Silver and Australia "B" (Jason Faulkner, Damien Dowling and Bailey Groves) took the Bronze.

The next final for the day was 10m Air Pistol Junior Men. Sergei Evglevski won the Gold, Nathan Blackburn Silver and Connor Longmire (NZL) the Bronze.

Next was 10m Air Pistol Women, where the quota place was won by Lalita Yauhleuskaya, as well as the Gold in the final. Lucy Philips (NZL) won the Silver and Jocyln Lees (NZL) won the Bronze. Om the team event, Australia "A" (Lalita Yauhleuskaya, Kristy Gillman and Emily Esposito) took the Gold, Australia "B" (Elena Galiabovitch, Hayley Chapman and Sue Guy) the Silver and New Zealand the Bronze.

The last final for the day was 10m Air Pistol Women Junior. Sascha Kroopin excelled, comfortably winning the Gold. Alison Heinrich won the Silver and Ryana Cook won the Bronze.


Day Seven: The so called "blue ribbon" event – 50m Pistol Men. Expected to be the hardest event to achieve an MQS, it was quite evident just over half way through the match that Daniel Repacholi was the only athlete on the line who could obtain the score needed. That turned out to be correct when Daniel finished the match with 543. In the final, Daniel powered ahead to take the Gold Medal 33.3 points ahead of Thomas Nobes (NZL), who took home the Silver, while Ricky Zhao (NZL) took the Bronze. In the teams, Australia "A" (Daniel Repacholi, Jason Faulkner and Damien Dowling) won the Gold,

Australia "B" (Mike Knapp, Bailey Groves and Bruce Quick) won the Silver and New Zealand followed, winning the Bronze.

25m Standard Pistol Men was the second match conducted, resulting in Bruce Quick (AUS) taking the Gold, Kerry Bell (AUS) the Silver and Jason Wakeling (NZL) the Bronze. Bruce had a comfortable win by 14pts. In the team event, Australia "A" (Bruce Quick, Kerry Bell and Jason Williams) were awarded the Gold Medals, with New Zealand taking Silver.

Day Eight: The final day and the last match of Oceania. 25m Rapid Fire Pistol turned out to be the most exciting final of the competition. In the final, the three remaining finalists ended up with tied scores for the Bronze Medal, which meant a three way shoot off. This resulted in David Chapman taking the Bronze, while Bruce Quick and Sergei Evglevski had one more series to shoot for the Gold. Sergei held his composure, with four hits in the final series. He beat Bruce by two hits, winning the Gold and leaving Bruce to take home the Silver. David Chapman was the only athlete to shoot an MQS in the qualification match, resulting in David winning the quota place.

An excellent result for Australia, winning all five quota places! Congratulations to all the team members.
