

From the president

As previously reported the WA1500 World Association has granted Pistol Australia the right to host the 2019 WA1500 (PPC) World Championships. Two clubs/Associations applied to host this prestigious event namely Yarra Pistol Club (Victoria) and the Southern Highlands Shooting Complex at Hill Top (near Bowral NSW). I note that the Hill Top range is yet to be built but have been told it will be completed by late 2018.

At the October Executive meeting it was voted and passed that the range at Hill Top will host this event. When completed the range will be run by Robyn Ginger from SISC.

Following the close of applications for Team Managers in 2018 for WA1500, Metallic Silhouette and Action Pistol I can confirm that the appointed Team Managers for 2018 are Judy Harding (Qld) (Metallic Silhouette), Lindsay Jones (NSW) (WA1500) and Nick Barnard (NT) (Action Pistol). I take this opportunity to thank Martin O'Brien (WA1500) and Geoff Horton (Action Pistol) for their support to our elite athletes and for a job well done.

As previously report PA is going through a Constitutional review restructure with the view to be coming a Company by Guarantee Ltd and managed by a Board of Management structure.

We have employed a constitution consultant to help us through the review process.

A survey has been sent to the State and Territory Associations to complete to give us their views on the direction they believe PA should take and also an understanding of their own constitutional structure to see if they will align with PA.

Pistol Australia was fortunate to share with Shooting Australia the services of Ralf Shuman for a specific Rapid Fire coaching seminar at Brisbane from the 26th – 28th October 2017.

Ralf is the former many times World and Olympic Champion in the Rapid Fire Pistol event.

PA funded the State and Territory Coaching Directors or their nominees to attend this 3 day seminar where Ralf conducted coach the coach presentations and separate coaching for the athletes who attended. PA funded 6 athletes. They were joined with three from the (SA) Aiming 4 Gold Squad. In specific Ralf encouraged and coached how to shoot the 4 second series and in particular competing in the Rapid Fire final. There was on the line coaching by Ralf for the athletes while shooting. From all reports Ralf was well received by all present.

The five (5) selection test events have been completed for our athletes to gain selection in the 2018 Commonwealth Games Team.

After the Shooting Australia (SA) High Performance Committee has met the names of those selected will be forwarded to Commonwealth Games Australia for endorsement before being announced.

The Brisbane International Shooting Centre (BISC) had its first big test for all the electronic target systems when the Commonwealth Shooting Federation (CSF) and Oceania Shooting Federation (OSF) conducted their championships on the new facility 30th Oct — 7th Nov. Other than a few minor technical problems all events proceeded well. The Finals Range is a

magnificent range complete with green artificial grass to the 50m range. It caters for 10m, 25m and 50m with the 10m and 25m target assemblies on castor wheels to roll away when not in use. The outstanding performance in all of the finals was by Sergie Evglevski in rapid Fire when he beat the two Indian team members in the (CSF) final by two hits scoring 28 hits. In the final he scored two 5 hits consecutively. Just an hour later Sergie won the (OSF) final with 32 hits setting a new (OSF) record. There was great excitement during all the finals with three shoot offs for eliminations, pistol malfunctions, target malfunction and claimed missing hits.

There has been a change at the PA office with Shawn resigning to take up a new position with Shooting Australia. We wish Shawn all the best in his new position with Shooting Australia.

We advertised for a replacement Sport Administrator and were fortunate to appoint Mr Noel Harrod to the position. Further to his recent experience, Noel has filled roles such as Executive Officer positions in state sporting bodies; Business Manager, Commercial Operations at the Australian Sports Commission; High Performance Manager Australian Canoeing; Finance Manager and Accountant in various organisations; Company Secretary for both a University College and a senior High School College and Section Manager Australian Olympic Committee Sydney 2000. A highly experienced and qualified sport administrator, Noel is also an accomplished international and Olympic water polo referee, accredited coach in water polo, rugby union. We welcome Noel as part of our Team.



I admit I have struggled with what to write about for this issue of the Bulletin. Much of my life at the moment revolves around the Commonwealth Games and all the things happening in the lead up to the Games themselves.

Because I am working for GOLDOC I am temporarily living in Brisbane — and it will be temporary as I do not like heat and even less do I like humidity! I am now up at 4:30 most mornings (no daylight saving here) and in bed correspondingly early at night. Will this make me healthy, wealthy & wise? — healthy maybe, not so sure about the rest! However, the move has also given me the opportunity to get to know the state of the art facility now at Belmont.

In preparation for the Commonwealth Games the government have spent millions of dollars upgrading the existing QTS smallbore ranges and building a new 25m range with 40 bays. There are now a 60 bay 10m range, a 60 bay 50m range and a 25m 40 bay range, as well as a complete Finals range. All are fully electronic, fitted with SIUS target systems.

The range has already had a good workout. At the beginning of October Queensland Target Shooting (smallbore) and Pistol Shooting Queensland ran a combined state titles. Despite a number of software issues, which were due as much to a lack of training on the system as anything else, the weekend was a great success. I heard a lot of praise for the ranges from the competitors.

The big workout, however, happened just last week when Shooting Australia ran an operational trial to ensure the range was ready for the Games. Many of the staff for the trial were those who have volunteered for the Games and the feedback from the competition will be invaluable in making the Games a memorable and successful event. The locals took the opportunity to spend as much time with the SIUS staff as possible so that they could learn the system.

Once the Games are over the venue will once again be leased to QRA and the current tenants will be able to resume their activities (Pistol Shooting Queensland is a tenant at Belmont). Known as BISC, the facility will be managed jointly by the stakeholders. Let us hope that this legacy is well used in future. For a start the Pistol Australia ISSF Nationals will be held at BISC in early June, which will be your opportunity to shoot on this new range.

Closer to home the NRC continues, through its judges and the state referee bodies, to qualify range officers and judges, to accredit holster examiners and continues to facilitate ongoing learning. Many of the emails that come my way involve interpretation of a rule or in some cases advice on where to find a particular rule. This is something that happens at all levels — I am off to Munich tomorrow for a meeting of the ISSF Pistol Committee, where we will discuss aspects of the ISSF rules that have been queried or amended since they were issued at the beginning of the year! Unfortunately, there will be updates early in the new year!

On a sad note I have to advise the John Harris (South Australia judge) passed away recently. John will be missed by many as he was a familiar face at our ISSF Nationals. On behalf of the NRC and all the judges and officials who knew John I wish Joan all the best as she copes with this loss.

WA1500 Match Overlay



Ralf Schumann is a Champion. One of the most decorated in Olympic history, and by far the most successful rapid fire shooter the world has seen! His achievements are too numerous to list, but as a start, 3 times Olympic Champion (1992, 1996, 2004) with plenty of Silver, Bronze and World Cup Championships over a 30 year period. So it was a huge achievement and an absolute pleasure to have Ralf Schumann for a whole week to teach and train the Shooting Australia and Pistol Australia Rapid Fire Shooter development squads and coaches from states and territories around Australia.

For those that are not familiar with Rapid Fire Pistol, it is one of the 3 Olympic pistol shooting events for men. Australia has the current Commonwealth Games Champion in David Chapman, who won Gold at Glasgow in 2014. The match consists of two halves, with 5 targets at a distance of 25 meters. This is a timed fire event, where you have 8 seconds to shoot all 5 targets and you do this twice. Then the timing is reduced to 6 second to shoot all 5 targets, twice again. Finally the time is reduce to 4 seconds to shoot all 5 targets, and this is also done twice. Then this sequence is repeated in the second half of the match. The top 6 qualifying scores go into a final, where the 4 second sequence is run. Now a points system is in place where you need to shoot a 9.7 or above for 1 point. After the 1st four rounds, the person with the lowest score is eliminated, and

this continues each round till a Gold Medallist is crowned.

Ralf's ethos is 'Learn from a Champion to become a Champion!' and I can tell you now, he did not disappoint. Ralf was methodical in his approach, and on the very first day after we made out introductions, he put us all on the line and let us shoot. Ralf did not look at our scores, he looked at our technique. He spent time with each shooter, taking notes and filming with his iPad. Having a champion like Ralf Schumann watching your every move, only inches away from you, really makes your heart race. He would also come up behind each shooter and nudge our elbows, checking our stability. After he assessed each shooter, we sat down and he went through his notes. For a person of his caliber, he was honest and empathetic to each shooter. He not only told us what we needed to work on, he also told as what we were doing right, which was reassuring.

I had a few things to work on, most importantly my stance. I was leaning too far backwards and therefore weakening my body and not allowing it to pivot properly for accurate movement on the targets. This was most evident when Ralf played back the iPad footage and used a program to show the angle of my body and how far away it was from the optimal stance.

I was also moving into the targets and just shooting, rather than a clean stop and making each shot a precision shot. Ralf then checked my triggering and my trigger, and looked at me and said, we need to fix this! . He also mentioned that changing a trigger just

before a big competition (the QLD State titles were on the weekend!) could be problematic, but I wasn t going to let an opportunity to have my trigger fixed by a world champion slip me by! I had a single stage rolling trigger, and he took my pistol and explained to me how the Pardini RF trigger system worked. He went about and showed me how to change it to a two stage trigger with a very heavy first stage (about 750grams) and a crisp 2nd stage (with only 250-350 grams left before it went off). This way my finger was doing most of the work on the first stage, allowing a light, crisp, clean break for the 2nd stage. This is easier said than done, as when the pressure is on, it is very hard to feel the 2nd stage and there might be a few early shots into the ground. This is exactly what happened in the next training session, but Ralf assured me when I become confident in my trigger, it will yield many x's. He was right, at the State titles, no shots into the ground, and a 99/100 in the 8 second series, shooting precision shots (the faster series still need work!)

The rest of the week we worked on Ralf's suggestions, and between all the shooters and the coaches we really helped each other out. The great thing was Ralf still found time to provide personal assistance to each shooter. He would watch closely and let us know how we were progressing. Again, he not only critiqued us, he also complimented us and told us what we were doing right, therefore reinforcing correct technique.

The week also consisted of a group coaching session each day, where Ralf held a power point presentation. It covered a wide range of topics from training methods, fitness, diet, grips, and the dedication it takes to be a champion. I am a relatively new shooter, so I took notes throughout, and accepted every word as gospel, but there were some long held ideas that were quashed in the way we have been training rapid fire pistol in Australia.

Besides being a great learning opportunity for the shooters, it was even more beneficial for Shooting Australia and Pistol Australia in the long term to have the state couches there. I feel we should put a national training model together based on the training principles taught by Ralf Shumann, and the notes from all the coaches who attended to allow a uniform system of training throughout all the states. Then a clear and consistent yearly schedule with reportable results for developing shooters.





The fact that the 50M pistol match has been removed from the Olympic schedule, Rapid Fire Pistol and 10m Air Pistol are the only Olympic events left for men, and putting quality resources through our coaches to develop the current crop of Rapid Fire pistol shooters and the next generation of Rapid Fire Pistol is imperative to the success of ISSF pistol shooting in Australia.

Kudos to all the people who were involved in organizing Ralf Schumann and the training camp, let hope this momentum keeps going and we can generate a long line of Rapid Fire Shooters in Australia.



Forty four shooters attended the championships held at the Inverell Pistol Club Delungra Range. Competitors travelled from Victoria, ACT. Queensland, NSW and one from Western Australia.

A small number of shooters from Queensland arrived on the Wednesday to set up camp and were happy with the warm 33 degree temperature. The shock hit the next day when the temperature only rose to 8 degrees, following a very cool night. A large number of shooters turned up for the practice day on the Thursday, with lots of comments on Delungra 'turning on the great weather for them'. The day was very cool and very windy, proving a challenge for shooters. The club house was a good option for the shooters, providing needed shelter from the wind and the cold. There was a long line up for the gun check that afternoon with the majority of the shooters opting to have their gun check that day.

The windy weather continued on the first day of the competition, however, maximum scores were achieved by a number of competitors. Campers experienced a couple of very cool nights and the temperature dropped to -2 degrees, with frost on the approach to the range on Saturday morning. Fortunately the weather improved throughout the competition. It is hard to believe that the following week saw temperatures in the mid 30's.

The Inverell mayor Paul Harmon opened the championship on Friday afternoon and after filling out a P650 form shot a few rounds off, successfully taking down a few silhouettes. The newly reformed Delungra Branch of the CWA, assisted by secretary Sue Shoemark and Alison Taylor kept the crowd well fed. Mr Adam Marshall, local member for the New England visited the shoot on the Saturday and was impressed with the range.

In the Production category there were six people on forty, including Glen Anderson, Kim Emery, Dave Dewsbury, Michael Arden , Richard Blayden and Kirsten Jackes . After the shoot off on Sunday Glen Anderson took out the category.

Mr Peter McCarthy the president of the Delungra Development Committee gave a shor speech about Delungra and then assisted Pistol Australia President Mr Ray Andrews with the presentation of prizes.

Lachlan Moore took out the junior champion category.

The individual four match aggregate was taken out by Kim Emery from Mt Lindesay Club while the 200m Women's aggregate was taken out by Judy Harding. Glen Anderson (Inverell) took out Production with a perfect score, Tim Anderson (Narrabri) Revolver with a perfect score ,Matt Seears (Merringanowry) Standing on 29, and Kim Emery (Mt Lindesay) Unlimited on 39. The club held a Full size Unlimited side match which was taken out by Cheyne Fischer (SSPC ACT) with a perfect score.

The NSW Production team of Glen Anderson and Kim Emery took out the Production Open team award, with John and Judy Harding for Old 2nd, and Michael Arden and James Moore from Vic 3rd. The Qld team of Peter Kenington and Judy Harding took out 1st place in the Revolver Open teams, with the NSW team of Matt Seears and Glen Anderson coming in 2nd and the Victorian team of Michael Arden and James Moore 3rd. The standing open teams was won by the team of Matt Seears and Kim Emery for NSW, with John and Judy Harding for Old 2nd and 3rd Michael Arden and James Moore for Victoria. The NSW team of Glen Anderson and Dave Dewsbury took out 1st p[lace in the Unlimited open team John Harding for Qld 3rd.

The Team Aggregate category was taken out by NSW on 276 points, Qld 2nd on 246 points and Victoria on 214 points. The Women's Team Aggregate was won by Qld on 249 points.

It was great to see our local members performing well, with Glen Anderson and Chris Taylor in the top 7 of the 4 match aggregate awards. Spirits were high throughout the tournament with lots of positive comments from competitors and partners. We look forward to catching up with everyone again next year for our annual Big Bore Shoot in February and the National Small Bore Championships in March.

- All resident Australian competitors must be a current financial member of Pistol Australia.
- The Championships will be held over three
 (3) days under Pistol Australia (IMSSU) Rules.

 Persons entering more than four (4) matches must be available for the three (3) days.
- 3. Gun Checks will be supervised by the Jury and will commence at 3:00pm on
- 4. Thursday 1st March 2018, and also one (1) hour prior to competition on other days.
- 5. All Competitors should be graded and grading cards will be requested at Registration.
- 6. Shooters should be ready at least 10 minutes before their squadded relay.
- 7. Shooting will commence at 9.00am each day unless advised otherwise.
- 8. Shooters or their spotters will be required to stand and paint the targets. Suitable footwear and
- 9. clothing must be worn on the range.
- Qualified or suitably experienced persons will accept range duties where indicated in their squadding details.

- 11. Each State / Territory is eligible to enter the following teams:
 - Two (2) person Four Match Aggregate for Small Bore in Open, Women's & Junior categories.
 - Two (2) person Two Match Aggregate for Field Pistol in Open, Women's & Junior categories.
- 12. Tied scores will be determined in the following manner:
 - First, second & third place in each category must be decided by shoot-off if scores are equal;
 - Four Match and Two Match Individual and Team Aggregates decided by reverse count back i.e. total number of rams, then total number of turkeys etc. If scores are still equal the tie will be broken by a shoot-off of five (5) shots per category;
 - Ties for first, second and third places in grades will be decided by reverse count and then by shoot-off if still equal;
 - Shoot-off sequence will be: Field Pistol -Production Sight and Production Any Sight;

- Small Bore Standing, Revolver, Production and Unlimited.
- Where a competitor is involved in more than one shoot-off in the same category, the first score will count for both shoot-offs.
- · Shoot-off targets will be as follows:
- Small Bore Standing and Field Pistol appropriate turkeys at 75m.
- Production and Revolver turkey, pig, chicken, pig, turkey at 100m.


