# From the president

RAY ANDREWS OAM

Unfortunately the big news for 2017 is not good news for shooting. The International Olympic Committee (IOC) is pushing for changes in shooting for Tokyo 2020. They want ISSF to achieve gender equality in the number of events specific to female and male competitors.

They intend to drop 50m Pistol (free Pistol) from the Olympic programme and introduce a mixed air pistol event. They also intend to remove a clay target and a rifle match. Representation has been made to the ISSF informing them that Australia (along with many other countries) does not agree with the proposal. It's a wait and see for the final outcome but I wouldn't bet a lot of dollars on the change not happening. I have copied the reply from the ISSF for your firsthand information.

For all our athletes aspiring to be in the 2018 Commonwealth Games Team 2017 is your big year. There are five (5) Shooting Australia Endorsed Events where you can gain points to possibly be nominated for the Commonwealth Games Team. You can also gain points for selection in the Commonwealth Shooting Championships/Oceania Shooting Championships Team for the event in Brisbane 30 October – 7 November 2017.

I have listed below the selection events. If you compete in all five the event with your lowest points score will not be counted in the aggregate. So in fact you can only have one bad day.

All this information is available on the Shooting Australia web site.

## Pistol Nomination/Selection

Selection Event 1 VAPA ISSF State Titles Yackandandah, Vic 10-13 March

Selection Event 2 PA ISSF Nationals Cessnock, NSW 9-16 September

Selection Event 3 NSW Amateur Pistol Assoc. Grand Prix SISC, NSW 18-20 August

Selection Event 4 Sydney Cup 2 SISC, NSW 13-15 October

Selection Event 5 SA Open Belmont, Qld 1-3 December

With only around 8 weeks to the Pistol Australia ISSF/PA National Championships in Cessnock it's time to dust off your training program and put it to use. This is the 60<sup>th</sup> ISSF/PA Nationals and all members who enter will receive a commemorative pin badge. The entry form is on the PA web and don't forget the closing date is Friday 3<sup>rd</sup> March 2017.

## Letter from ISSF

Dear Mr. Marangon,

Thank you for your letter of 5 December regarding the ISSF's initial recommendations for achieving gender equality in the Olympic Games Shooting Program.

We appreciate your concerns regarding the strong opinions and emotions that the changes necessary to achieve gender equality in Shooting are causing. We understand your desire to "consider delaying these changes until after Tokyo 2020," but that unfortunately is not an option. The IOC has made it clear to its International Federations that the IOC aim is "have equal men's and women's events and athletes by Tokyo 2020." The ISSF must present its recommendations for changes to the IOC before the end of February 2017. The IOC Sports Department, Program Commission and Executive Committee will then study our recommendations in the light of their evaluations. IOC decisions for the 2020 Olympic Shooting Program are due to be released in July 2017.

We are compiling all of the comments we receive so they can be considered by the ISSF Ad Hoc Committee on the Olympic Games Program, the ISSF Executive Committee and the ISSF Administrative Council before the final ISSF gender equality recommendations will be decided and sent to the International Olympic Committee (IOC) in February. The demand for gender equality in Olympic sports is real. This is an especially difficult challenge for Shooting because we now have nine events and about 60 percent participation quotas for men and only six events and about 40 percent participation quotas for women. The Shooting sport must change or be changed to achieve gender equality for the Tokyo 2020 Olympic Games.

As your federation continues to evaluate the ISSF's recommendations to achieve gender equality by Tokyo 2020, we kindly ask you to consider and remember the following key points that have guided us to prepare these ISSF gender equality recommendations:

- The IOC is serious when it states that it wants to achieve gender equality in all sports by Tokyo 2020.
- Shooting has become one of the leading sports in the Olympic Games because the ISSF has collaborated and cooperated with the IOC.
- The selection of Shooting events to delete and add must be based on the future, not the past. ISSF recommendations to the IOC must support the worldwide development of Shooting Sport and not of individual events.

Your comments and concerns regarding these difficult decisions are appreciated. We assure you that we will keep them in consideration for our next meetings where we will also consider the IOC event-based evaluation of the Rio Olympic Games, which is expected to be released in January.

We will keep you informed as our recommendations are made and submitted to the IOC for their final decisions.

## From the NCC

**Well here we are near the end of February already so I trust you all had a break over Xmas and are now in training for what is going to be a big year for both our senior and junior athletes.**

For some of our Juniors there is the opportunity to gain selection in the Shooting Australia (SA) Team to compete in the ISSF Junior World Championships to be held in Suhl from the 23<sup>rd</sup> – 29<sup>th</sup> June 2017. To be eligible for selection you must achieve the Junior Bench Mark Score (JBMS) for the events you wish to compete in. A JBMS must be obtained at a Shooting Australia endorsed competition between the 1<sup>st</sup> January 2017 and the 7<sup>th</sup> May 2017. The dates of the (SA) endorsed events are on the (SA) web site and the selection criteria is also available on the Shooting Australia web site.

The Pistol Australia annual junior training camp will be held in Canberra from Saturday 1<sup>st</sup> to Saturday 8<sup>th</sup> July 2017. Accommodation this year will be at the Ibis Styles, Eagle Hawk. This venue has been used previously by the PA National Development Squad and all reports are good. As in the past we can cater for 16 juniors at the camp and as in the past up to 8 juniors from the 2016 camp will be invited back and the remainder will be nominated by either your Coaching Director or your Association. If you're interested you need to contact them to inform them you would like to attend. The camp is during the school holidays for most.

It is a fun week with some serious training and also fun free time and the other benefit is that all costs are paid by PA, except your spending money of course. All details are available on the PA web site.

The other big event for juniors is the Youth Olympic Games (YOG) to be held in Buenos Aires, Argentina Oct 1 – 12 2018. The events are air pistol male (60 shot) and air pistol female (40 shot). To be eligible you must have been born between 1 January of 2000 and 31 December 2003. You must also compete in the selection event in Brisbane 28 – 29 October 2017. At the selection event you must achieve YOG MQS Air Men 540 – Air Women 355.

The entries were down in the 2016 Shooting Australia Junior Championships compared to 2015. I realise it's still a long way off, but I can inform you that this year the event will be staged in Brisbane 8<sup>th</sup> – 10<sup>th</sup> December on the new Commonwealth Games Range at the Belmont Shooting Complex.

So mark this date in your training and competition diary. For the benefit of all juniors and parents, below is the definition of a junior competitor.

*For PA and ISSF competitions, juniors are athletes who will be under the age of 21 on December 31st in the year of competition. ♦*

# From the NRC

**I am often asked how and why I got into judging. When the question comes from fellow shooters I am never sure if it is because they are wanting to follow in my footsteps or want to avoid falling into the same trap! When it comes from acquaintances who know nothing about our sport it is in some ways a lot easier to answer. The how is easy, the why is a little less so.**

When people outside of the sport ask it is normally “how” rather than “why” – and of course that is quite easy – natural progression and a pre-disposition to be bossy! I have in fact been lucky. Firstly the Sydney 2000 Olympics gave us opportunities that we may not otherwise have had, I have had the support of both Shooting Australia and Pistol Australia as well as that of countless individuals, I have been fortunate to make friends overseas during my stints as a jury member and I have a husband who supports me 100% even though he thinks pistol shooting is boring!???

I recall many years ago being told that there was an ISSF range officer course and I should do it. Being a lousy shot, but someone who enjoyed the sport nonetheless, I thought “why not?” And since I hate failing I worked hard enough to get through – despite the trauma of the practical assessment! I found I actually enjoyed running ranges and with practice I felt that I became reasonably capable as both a range officer and a scorer. RO qualifications for Service and Black Powder were a doddle after the ISSF one!

The next step was Judge B – and I fell into that trap like a fly into the spider’s web! The SRC director got up at a VAPA meeting and asked for expressions of interest. When I enquired as to what was involved I was told not much, just some paperwork and another test. OK! “Just some paperwork” turned into 25 increasingly convoluted scenario based questions, the answers to which were then critiqued by 2 A judges for feedback. And another traumatic practical assessment – aarghh! Once again, Service and Black Powder were not at all scary after that.

Judge ‘A’ was a natural progression and much less traumatic, despite being interviewed by a panel of 3 senior judges who had always put the fear of the proverbial into me.

Why do I keep doing what I do? Well, I like to keep busy would be one reason. On the ISSF side I have made friends around the world and am now in a position to put Australia’s views on rules and procedures (doesn’t mean anyone takes any notice of course!). As far as the NRC is concerned – I would like to think that I am contributing to the continued development of our sport and support of all the PA endorsed events.

The other question I get is “how do I become a judge?”. My response is normally along the lines of apply to your State Referee Council – but I will try to discuss what is involved as well. Assuming the person has had extensive experience as a range officer I would advise that the training follows a set pathway. There are a number of scenario based questions to be worked on – and the response is a lot more than just a rule number. We are looking for the ability to interpret the rules, analyse the situation and provide a solution that is within the spirit and intent of the rules and is fair to ALL competitors. At the same time I will tell the potential candidate to get as much experience as possible under the umbrella of working with rostered judges at sanctioned competitions.

Judge A? Well, in Australia the only real difference is experience. A judge A is supposedly well versed in all the PA and ISSF matches OR Metallic Silhouette OR Action Match. These latter are currently the only where discipline specific Judges A are appointed. The downside of being an A judge is that if you are on a jury you cannot be shooting. Will this ever change – no, at least not for a jury member at a national championship. What could be changed is the way we qualify the PA/ISSF Judges A – maybe it is time to think about more discipline specifics in that area as well?

Who knows what the future holds but I hope we can all continue to embrace the changes and also maintain the standards of Australian judges in all disciplines. ♦

# PA National Development Squad

**The objective of this squad is to help develop athletes in ISSF Pistol for high level competition with a view to their inclusion in Shooting Australia Squads for international selection.**

Not everyone wants to be a competitive shooter but it is hoped that these high performance athletes will take their learning back to local club shooters and pass on their knowledge. By the same token there needs to be a place provided for budding Olympic athletes to start their career path.

Over the past 3 years some well-known athletes have been part of this development squad such as Serge Evglevski, Alison Heinrich and Elena Galiabovitch.

This year the squad comprised

Alison Heinrich , Cicon Smith , Damian Dowling , Jason Faulkner , Kerry Bell , Garry Heinrich , Gaurav Pilaniya, Vahid Sherafati , Adrian Berthelsen and Chris Pitt. This year's coaches are Allan Lozsan, Alex Kupke , and Peter Heuke (also coordinator)

A lot of PA members, social and club shooters would likely not have knowledge of what this is all about, so this is a rundown of how and why the PA NDS works.

It should be noted that this is an essential part of the PA structure to ensure coaching and learning is delivered, develop international competitors and to obtain funding for the sport and ensure survival of the sport over the long term.

There have been 4 squad camps this year. The first two were at the Sydney International Shooting Centre to provide training and support/competition to the Olympic team before the Rio Olympics. Two other camps in October and January 2017 were held at the Canberra National Pistol Club range.

Camps run from between 3 and 4 1/2 days to fit in best with personal work commitments, where possible. This year matches trained were Women's /Men Air Pistol, 50 M Pistol, and Ladies 25 M Pistol. These events were specific to the athletes involved. The general format is training first day, Proof Matches on day 2, and training and fault correction for the remainder of the camp. The October camp included sessions on physiology and body structure provided by Jim Olds

BHSc Musculoskeletal Therapy. Jim is a Level 3 Coach from Queensland.

A specific programme of training tasks is provide to take home. In particular this year the aim has been to improve hold ability. A training camp in Korea last year showed a large difference in hold ability between the Korean and the Australian shooters so this matter was specifically addressed.

The Scatt laser training system has been used and recorded at each camp to monitor shooter progress in many areas, for example hold area and trigger movement.

A good example of this is in relation to Air pistol triggers which have been altered to have a very light last stage, i.e. 450 grams first pressure and 55 grams last pressure. Although thinking might suggest this would lead to more accurate shooting, more often than not the opposite occurs , as it leads to point shooting, tapping the trigger, instead of squeezing it. It was very noticeable at the last PA Junior camp that many air pistols were set up this way. This leads to tapping of the shot instead of a conditioned reflex squeeze. This leads to incorrect training and then gets taken forward to other matches.

The Target Scan App, available to anyone with a Smart Phone, is being used by squad members for photos and forward pictures of targets to the coaches for comment and assessment.

This App records the target pictures and scores and formats them for email distribution.

A file of each shooters targets is held as hard copy and is valuable to watch progress.

Target Scan has helped to reduce the isolation squad face with members spread from one side of the continent to the other.

Squad selection is annual, and starts with the Pistol Australia Nationals each year. State bodies through their respective State Coaching Councils can submit athletes for consideration.

The basis this year and into 2017 is to provide opportunities for our developing shooters to attain Commonwealth Games selection.

The selection criteria for commonwealth Games Gold Coast are on the Shooting Australia web site.

Starting with the Victorian State Titles at Yackandandah Vic. 10-13 March. There are 5 selection events through to December. ♦



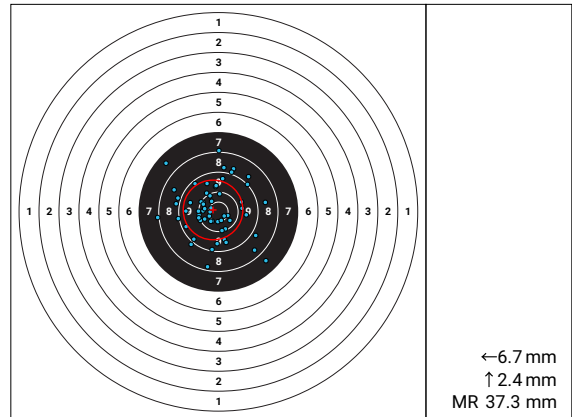
