Pistol Australia is currently undergoing a Constitution and Governance Review and Melanie Woosnam from Active 8 Solutions presented information on Good Governance, Compliance, and the PA Constitution to the Executive and Management at the May Executive Meeting in Melbourne. # Visual training – improving your aiming accuracy

In order to determine ways to improve aiming accuracy we first need to understand the manner in which pistol shooters use their visual skills. Research suggests that the aiming task consists of two separate components (i) a cognitive component related to determining the distance between the gun sight aiming point and the target centre and (ii) a physical component that determines the minimum margin of error for executing the aiming task. It is suggested that this second component is due to the effects of body sway and arm/hand tremor.

Cognitive requirements dictate that as expertise increases, the time for aiming or 'quiet eye' (QE), increases and the time to stabilise the pistol decreases. QE is a period of time when the gaze is stable on a spot that gives spatial information critical to effective motor performance or an accurate shot.<sup>1</sup> Put simply, expert shooters take more time to aim at a target and less time to adjust the pistol and arm, whereas novices spend more time adjusting their posture and less time aiming.

Research from the Korean Institute of Sports Science supports the fact that experts produce more effective results by increasing duration of QE and spending more time aligning the rear sight to the target than those less skilled. Furthermore, experts are more efficient in managing these tasks under time constraints or during periods of increased pressure such as in the rapid fire event and/or during major competitions.

The difference in performance due to levels of experience appears to lie mainly in the physical aspect of the aiming task, namely in errors caused by body sway or tremors. Learning to control body sway during the aiming and trigger phase provides the shooter with more QE, which improves aiming accuracy.<sup>2</sup> Further research from the Republic of China indicates that postural tremors experienced by air pistol shooters are linked to the shooter's skill and that elite shooters can maximise their control of the pistol – hand segments, which determines greater shooting success.<sup>3</sup> In discussing previous research, it is worth noting the research conducted by Lajie et al who looked at improving performance by decreasing forearm tremor by way of

cooling the forearm using a cold pack wrapping. I bet someone reading this will try that over the weekend. Who says research is boring?

Expert shooters also appear to fix their gaze directly on the target or at a point between the target and the pistol. Conversely, less skilled shooters tend to position their gaze on the sight and follow its movement towards the target.<sup>4</sup> With an understanding of the visual differences of aiming between shooters of differing skill levels, coaches will have some idea of what they should be looking for and how they can guide young or inexperienced shooters towards improved performance.

Scientific research indicates that the value of visual training to improve aiming accuracy remains unclear<sup>5,6</sup> yet many coaches and athletes use these practices on a regular basis. Some studies show that both knowledge of results (what the shot scored) and knowledge of performance (feedback on shooters technique) have equal value in their own right and are not always required simultaneously. Similarly, another project with pistol shooters showed little difference in performances between novice shooters who receive no assistance from the coach except to see their scores, and other shooters who are provided verbal coaching support. This suggests that novices learn equally as well by simply doing and seeing the result of their shot compared to shooters with continuous coaching.

There appears to be both anecdotal and practical support for the value of visual training as a means to improve shooting performance, especially with novice shooters. In particular the fact that the actual task of shooting develops

automatically and in doing so reduces the cognitive activity required and provides the shooter with more time to develop proper aiming alignment rather than control posture and arm segments.

Laser based software systems are regularly used in pistol shooting as both a diagnostic and training tool. A laser system provides excellent feedback for shooters to diagnose a sight or trigger issue. When utilising this system the shooters are provided with laser equipped pistols, given time to develop their shot to a satisfactory level and then the laser is turned on. If the laser centres on the target, the sights are properly aligned and the problem is not 'aim' based, but rather the problem is rooted elsewhere. In this case the coach can progress to drills to improve triggering and avoid the sight changing during the squeezing action.

If the laser is not centred it may be that you need to adjust the sight, the technique or both. Again, using a laser equipped pistol provides immediate and accurate feedback, which allows the shooter to correctly diagnose and then alter the shooting technique to improved accuracy.

Shooting with one or two eyes open has also been researched and the results show no effect as to whether one or two sides of the shooter's glasses are open for viewing. This suggests that shooters should simply choose the most suitable option for them rather than choose one option over another for technical reasons.

It appears that visual training can be integrated into every training session by firstly devoting to this as well as devoting time to understanding the differences between elite and novice shooters. Training sessions should provide opportunities for novices to develop the processes already learned by elite shooters. However, remember that postural control and stability is as important as the aiming process in improving shooting accuracy.

## From the NRC

### EQUIPMENT CONTROL

During the recent judge update seminars around the country one constant has emerged – it is often left to the duty judge(s) to run the equipment control section. If they don't do it, it probably won't get done! This, it seems, is a universal problem.

Such a situation is definitely NOT satisfactory. Equipment Control is an essential part of the competition and an organizing committee must allocate suitably trained people for this area.

If the judge is doing the actual checking then who is supervising, and who can be called on in the case of a protest?

If the judge is running EC then how can he be carrying out all his other duties – such as checking the ranges, supervising the shooting, supervising the scoring, dealing with problems and protests etc.?

So, is it really important? After all, the ISSF now leave it up to the shooter to decide if he will bother with EC or not, so why does PA not follow suit? The simple answer is that we are not in the business of catching out the unwary. At our sanctioned competitions, even nationals, there may well be competitors who have never actually had an opportunity to check their firearms properly – maybe their club does not have the equipment, maybe the competitions they have attended have only bothered with the box and trigger, maybe they have a new firearm that has not been checked and no-one has warned them it needs to be done before they shoot, etc. etc. etc.!

What seems to be overlooked in this debate is the importance the ISSF has now put on post-competition checks – not just trigger weight but a full check of the firearms, and more of them than we would do at a PA competition. This is time consuming, means automatic disqualification if failed, and – guess what – means a fully manned and equipment EC section is required to be set up!

The other vital function of EC is to check that all the firearms being used in the competition are fully safe – safety features of the firearms must be in place AND in good working order. Most of the ISSF firearms don't have inbuilt safety features but most of the firearms use for the Service, WA1500 and Action matches do – and so do many of the Black Powder firearms. For Metallic Silhouette matches the equipment control is an integral part of the event with strict guidelines on what firearms may be used for what matches.

Is this all a storm in a teacup – does it really matter if the barrel length is a mm too long or the trigger is a hair breadth too light? Well, I would say it does. There is a saying "give them an inch and they'll take a mile" (give them a millimetre and they'll take a kilometre just doesn't have quite the same ring to it!). In real terms no, a mm on the barrel length probably won't make a difference, but if we ignore the rule then who is to say what may happen in the future – and 5mms probably would make a difference!





The equipment rules are in place to help make the competition fair and equitable for all competitors – winning is based on the skill of the shooter and not on the variations to their equipment. Australian shooters love to question, test, bend and stretch the rules – but if they know what is required, and they know it will be checked, then there cannot (?J) be any grey area.

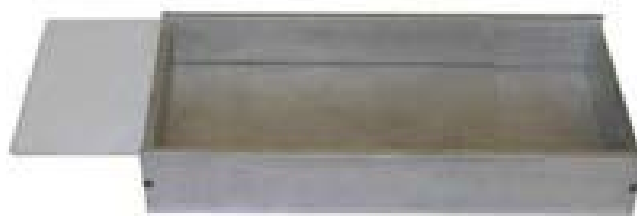
Running a competition soon? Don't have trained people to do the equipment control – and now you have been told the judge won't do it! – what to do? Why not run a training day at the club – have a local judge give your range officers and other volunteers some training and hands on experience in conducting EC.

Don't have bodies available for EC? – well, the simple response is "find some". You don't need to have the same people all day – the busy time is always first thing so have a couple of your experienced range officers allocated for the early part of the day, at least until you need them to run ranges. Do you have members who tend to stay away because they are no longer able to work on range – I am sure they'd like to be involved by being given a job they can cope with, and which is an important part of the competition. Later in the day you will be able rely on someone to be "on call" – what about sharing it with your canteen staff, or maybe you have someone in the score room who can keep an eye on EC for you?

So, you have EC up and running, your personnel are trained and efficient BUT have a tendency to let things go "just this once". Well, guess what – next time that firearm is presented to EC it is still going to fail and the competitor is likely to say "but it passed last time (and the time before, and the time before that etc). DON'T DO IT – have the necessary tools for firearms to be adjusted for this competition!

And always remember:

The Equipment Control Approval is valid only for the competition for which the inspection is made (GTR 10.10.8). ♦

## 21st Metallic Silhouette 100m Small Bore & Field Pistol National Championships

The Pistol Australia 100m Small Bore and Field Pistol Metallic Silhouette National Championships were conducted on the SSPC-ACT Pistol Club Range on the Majura Shooting Complex from the 3<sup>rd</sup> – 5<sup>th</sup> March, 2017. There were thirty seven competitors in total, all converging on Canberra either by car or plane. Twenty six came from all over NSW, four from QLD, three from Victoria, two from the ACT and one from WA.

Many came to the range on the practice day to check sight settings, but this was made difficult when the rain began mid-morning. The recent earthworks around the target rails and on the mounds quickly turned into a muddy quagmire. Nearly everyone tried to use only the sighter targets so that they didn't have to go out in the rain to stand those that had been knocked over. Gun check started late that afternoon and all those present headed to the clubhouse where it was dry and warm.

Friday, the first day of competition arrived with drizzle and dark clouds. The drizzle cleared and the day turned out pretty good despite the targets wallowing in the mud every time they were hit. Competitors tried hard to keep the soles of their shoes clean so as not to walk sticky mud through the shooting bays. The Opening Ceremony was held after the completion of shooting on Friday afternoon. Pistol Australia President, Ray Andrews, opened the 21<sup>st</sup> National Championships to a hearty round of

applause and then all the competitors tucked into a delicious BBQ put on by SSPC-ACT.

In the Production category there were only two perfect scores of "40" shot, by Kim Emery (NSW) and David Dewsbury (NSW). After the shoot offs on the Sunday afternoon, David was the eventual winner for Production.

In the Revolver category as well, there were two 40's shot, by Kim Emery (NSW) and Cheyne Fischer (ACT). At the end of the shoot offs, Cheyne was the victor for 2017.

The Standing category saw Matt Seears, Iain Yule and Glen Anderson, all from NSW all score 29. At the end of the shoot off, Iain was in first place, Matt second and Glen third.

In the Unlimited category scores were kept down because of heavy clouds and some rain making the small targets very hard to see against the dark background. Kim took out National Champion here with 37 and Matt Seears (NSW) and Kirsten Jackes (QLD), both on 36 fought it out in the shoot off with Matt taking second place and Kirsten third.

In the Field Pistol section, Bruce Dunbar (NSW) topped the Production category with an excellent 36 while Iain Yule (NSW) topped the Production Any Sight category with 35.

In the Team trophies, the Open Small Bore went to the NSW Team comprising Matt Seears and Kim

Emery and the Women's Small Bore went to the QLD Team comprising Kirsten Jackes and Judy Harding. The Field Pistol Open Team went to the NSW Team of Iain Yule and Matt Seears, while the Women's Field Pistol went to the QLD Team of Kirsten Jackes and Judy Harding.

In the individual aggregate trophies, the Open 4 Match Aggregate was won by Kim Emery (NSW) with a 143, the Women's by Kirsten Jackes (QLD) with a personal best of 131 and the Junior 4 Match Aggregate by Lachlan Moore (VIC) also with a personal best of 101. It was really great to have juniors in attendance once again and to watch Lachlan improve every time he shoots makes one feel really good. The Field Pistol Open 2 Match Aggregate was won by Iain Yule (NSW) with 66, the Women's by Judy Harding (QLD) with 54 and the Junior Aggregate by Lachlan Moore (VIC) with 41.

Small Bore and Field Pistol are done and dusted for 2017 – for the silhouette shooters across Australia we can now look forward to the 200m Big Bore National Championships being conducted by the Inverell RSM Pistol Club (NSW) from the 15<sup>th</sup> to 17<sup>th</sup> September, 2017. ♦

# 2017 ISSF/PA NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIPS

8–16 APRIL

Cessnock Pistol Club and the NSW Amateur Pistol Association were the hosts for the 60<sup>th</sup> ISSF/PA National Championships and to commemorate the anniversary a special 60<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Nationals pin was presented to all who participated.

The Club members are to be congratulated on their determination to run a successful Nationals (for the fourth time since 2009!) despite the recent very sad loss of their President and prime mover for these events, Lyndsay Haywood. It was marvellous to see all the familiar Cessnock Club faces filling their now very familiar roles and obviously all working to ensure that everything was done to his required standard.

Good organisation, good weather, good company and good competition made for a memorable week of shooting for the two hundred and fifty competitors. Also ensuring a good week were the many others who worked to ensure the success of the competition. They were the officials on the ranges, in the score room (now known as Results, Timing and Scoring – earning the acronym RATS) and Equipment Control, the range crews, the kitchen and BBQ team, those in the target preparation room and those who kept everything spic and span during the whole length of the Nationals.

The Opening Ceremony on Sunday 9<sup>th</sup> April got matters under way and Cessnock Mayor Doug Pynsett wished all competitors good shooting. As an adjunct to the ceremony, Chief RO Lee Scott took the opportunity to announce to a receptive audience that Club luminaries Kel Vickers, Daniel Repacholi, Blake Blackburn, Geoff Roberts, Doug Stapleton and Lyndsay Haywood were being honoured by having a range section named after each of them.

The first four days of competition feature the Pistol Australia events – Black Powder, Service Pistol and the WA1500 matches.

Mike Knapp (WA) and Brian Subkey (NSW) are this year's Black Powder Champions, each of them taking the top gong for their second time. The WA1500 Revolver Champion - Peter Brus (NSW) and the WA1500 Pistol Champion – Chris Banfield (TAS) are two young men firmly cementing their place at the top of the tree in BOTH these matches and their success at this event confirmed their provisional selection, along with top lady qualifier Linda Jekel, to represent Australia at the WA1500 World Championships to be held in Alsfeld, Germany in August this year.

Chris Banfield and the Tasmanian Team scooped the pool in Service 25Y, Jamie Longbottom (QLD) won Service Pistol and Dean Brus (NSW) topped Service Unrestricted.

The Wednesday evening dinner marking the conclusion of the PA events was the usual happy gathering with many successes to celebrate and many resolutions made to train harder for next year. The Perpetual trophy for the Black Powder 2 Match Aggregate was presented to Leo Caratti (WA), for the Service Pistol 3 Match Aggregate to Jamie Longbottom (QLD), and for the Service/Black Powder Aggregate to Leo Caratti.

The decks were cleared and made ready for the start of the ISSF events on Thursday morning and 2016 Olympian Elena Galiabovitch (VIC) led off with a win in 10m Air Pistol Women. She followed this up later in the week by becoming 25m Sport Pistol Champion. Then 2016 Olympian Dan Repacholi (NSW) chimed in with wins in 50m Pistol and 10m Air Pistol Men. Chris Pitt (QLD), 2016 Paralympian, claimed the titles in all three SPS (Shooting Para Sport) events - 10m Air Men, 50m Pistol and 25m Pistol. Teenager Sergei Evglevski (VIC) took home a swag of titles, winning two Open events, 25m Rapid Fire and 25m Standard Pistol as well as 50m Pistol Junior, 25m Rapid Fire Junior, 25m Pistol Junior, and 10m Air Junior Men. Worthy of special mention is the performance by Olivia Erickson (NSW) who made her first appearance on the podium as a National Champion, winning the 10m Air Junior Women event.

With a change to the Olympic Finals programs, new Finals records were established in 50m Pistol and 10m Air Pistol Men by Daniel Repacholi, in 25m Pistol and in 10m Air Pistol Women by Elena Galiabovitch and in 25m Rapid Fire by Sergei Evglevski. Sergei also set a new Qualification record of 574 in 25m Rapid Fire Junior.

The Nationals came to a conclusion at the celebratory Dinner on Sunday evening. This event is the occasion for presentation of the remaining Perpetual Trophies and congratulations go to Sergei Evglevski who won the Junior 2 Match Aggregate, Linda Ryan who won the Women's 3 Match Aggregate, Bruce Quick who won the Men's 5 Match Aggregate and Chris Pitt who won the 3 Match SPS Aggregate. Jeremy Kozak was the winner of the Iron Man 12 Match trophy.

A clean sweep for the NSW Team who maintained their recent iron grip on the PAK Manton Teams Aggregate and the Philip Adams All Teams Aggregate trophies.

As the winner of 10m Air Men, Dan Repacholi was the delighted recipient of the Match Guns MGH1 air pistol, a very generous and ongoing sponsorship donation provided by Mr. John Moore of Euroarms Pty Ltd. Pistol Australia greatly appreciates the continued opportunity to celebrate our Champions afforded by this sponsorship.

At past Nationals, a full list of past winners of every event, individual and teams, as well as the current records and a history of the records has been

published. The list obviously grows longer year by year and is now a very lengthy document indeed. It was decided that the Competitors' Information Booklet now contains only the current list of PA National Records. The aforementioned long lists, dating back to 1958 and updated annually, are now available to every PA member on the PA website, [www.pistol.org.au/national-records](http://www.pistol.org.au/national-records).

The Perpetual trophies presented to all the abovementioned very lengthy list of National Champions and Champion Teams have, over the years, become very dilapidated due to age and have suffered varying amounts of damage due to being moved backwards and forwards across the country to each year's Nationals. All the original trophies have now been retired (to a place of safety in the PA Office) and the bright new ones made their debut in Cessnock to very favourable comment.

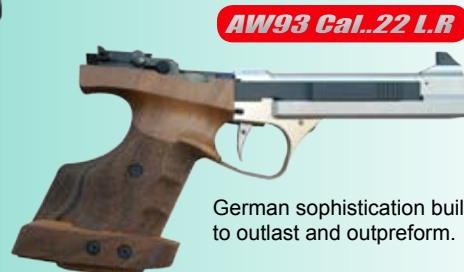
